Year 1

Iln Year 1 this Week...

English

Year 2

Year two have been working really hard this week!

In English, we have been planning our setting narratives and are ready to write them next week! We can't wait to read the children's wonderful ideas, that have been developed over the past few weeks, finally coming together.

In Maths we have been ordering numbers to 100 by considering place value.

In Science we were looking at forces and discussed pushing and pulling and how they impact the movement of an object.

Year 3

Wow! A busy week in Year! We have been working hard on our 'threat narrative' and we will be writing them up in neat next week. In maths, we have been ordering numbers up to 1000 and we will move on to addition and subtraction, next. In PHSE, we have been talking about 'cyberbullying' and 'conflict' Please ask your children to share their understanding of this with you – it is a very important part of our learning. In Art, we have been learning about the artist Clara Peeters and practising our shading techniques. Have a lovely weekend.

Year 4

What a busy week we have had in Y4. We have worked hard to spot patterns when counting in 25s, 50s and 500s and are able to add missing numbers to sequences. In English, we have used fronted adverbials, similes and personification to Write our whale spotting narratives. We have used some very impressive vocabulary!

We have planned a science investigation to test whether different plants grow at different rates when given the same conditions. We will predict and set up next week. In Shared reading, we are really enjoying a story about The Girl who Stole an Elephant not to mention the Queen's jewels. We can't wait to find out what happens next!

Year 5

In English, the children have examined our model biography and used the key features when planning their own biography about the life of Henry 'Box' Brown. In maths we have started to look at different strategies for adding numbers, including the use of number lines, near doubles and adjusting. We are also continuing with our fluency work which currently is focusing on our 2, 4 and 8 multiplication and division facts. In science, we planned our investigation to separate a mixture that required us to use sieving, filtering and evaporation Next week, we will test if our plan works. In PSHE, we considered the way villains are portrayed in films- often with some form of physical difference and considered how this made people born with physical differences feel. Next week, we have out visit to Tatton Park where we will learn more about the Anglo Saxons and Vikings.

Year 6

This week Y6 have been writing a bravery award speech for Rose Blanche in English. The children have worked hard to use only formal writing in their work. In Maths, we have continued to consolidate formal addition and subtraction methods and apply these to reasoning problems. In Art, the children are busy sewing their quilts. Following on from our trip to the Imperial War Museum, we have been learning about the causes of World War 1 as well as enjoying the documentaries the children made whilst on the trip last week!

We've observed a significant rise in the number of children arriving late this week. While it might not appear to be a major issue if your child is only five minutes late, it actually causes them to miss the beginning of the daily routine. This can be unsettling and may disrupt the teaching and learning environment of the entire class. Furthermore, being just five minutes late each day results in a loss of 25 minutes of learning each week, which adds up to a staggering 16 hours over the course of the year!

The school's attendance target is set at 96%.

Several classes have been impacted by families choosing to take vacations during term time. Please note that, in accordance With government guidelines, the Local Authority is imposing fines of £160 per parent, for each child, if there are more than five days of unauthorised absence due to holidays.



Maths Help at Home

What's the app about?

This first version of the app is aimed at Key Stage 1 pupils Individual one-minute tasks focus on adding and subtracting – and on 'Subitising', the skill of instantly recognising the number of items in a group without counting.

Multiplication and division topics are also now available!

How do we use it?

Children can choose any topic they want to try. They then answer a unique series of questions (so it's a different set of questions every time). If they're struggling with a question, a 'Hint' button will give a helpful clue by showing the question in a different but familiar way.

When the one minute's up, they'll see a feedback screen telling them how they've done.
