In spelling, We looked further into prefixes and the children enjoyed learning about it.

In Maths, we have started to think about 'finding the difference' and we will be continuing this next week.

In English, we have been planning for our own myth narrative as we have been designing our own creatures and writing a character description about them.

In computing, we have been exploring networks and thinking about routers and the world wide web.

Year 5

Year 5 have been planning their restoring an environment narrative in English and on Friday Wrote their first paragraph. In Maths, We have been finding unit and non unit fractions of quantities, using bar models to develop our understanding. In science We looked at simple mechanisms, including levers, pulleys and gears. We are looking forward to our visit to Jodrell Bank next Week to launch our new science unit looking at Earth and Space. Please remember to respond to the Ping sent out last Week.

Year 6

This week Y6 have begun working on a new book ("Varmints") as the inspiration for an environmental narrative. The children are working hard on their use of tense in this story as they have to write an epilogue at the end that changes from past tense to present tense. In Maths, we have been working hard on improving our arithmetic skills ahead of the SATS tests in May. In Computing we have been having fun designing houses using 3D modelling software Tinkercad.
